



## N1 - Bury East:

### Burglaries:

Woodgate Hill Road – 21<sup>st</sup> January early morning  
Unknown offender gains entry via insecure rear patio door to dining area, once inside offender is disturbed by a dog and leaves the house.

Arden Close – 21<sup>st</sup> January late evening  
Unknown offender approaches rear of premises and gains entry through the rear door which is closed but not insecure, once inside a search of the kitchen area is done and electrical items are stolen

### Burglary Other:

Linton Avenue -16<sup>th</sup> January early evening  
Unknown offender approaches insecure front door of church hall and gains entry, once inside a search is conducted and items are stolen.

### Theft from Motor Vehicles

Whitefield Road – 16<sup>th</sup> January early evening  
Unknown offender approaches owners drive from an unknown direction and cuts fuel pipe with unknown sharp instrument then begin to siphon fuel from vehicle.

Angouleme Way – 16<sup>th</sup> January early evening  
Unknown offenders approach parked secure vehicle and use unknown means to smash nearside window and steal property from within.

Whitefield Road – 17<sup>th</sup> January early morning  
Unknown offender approaches owners drive from an unknown direction and cuts fuel pipe with unknown sharp instrument then begin to siphon fuel from vehicle.

Redvales Road – 19<sup>th</sup> January early evening  
Unknown offender approaches owners drive from an unknown direction and cuts fuel pipe with unknown sharp instrument then begin to siphon fuel from 2 vehicles.

Horn Street – 22<sup>nd</sup> January early morning  
Unknown offender approaches parked van and proceeds to slide a long large silver object from underneath the van, no entry is gained and nothing is stolen.

### **Theft of Motor Vehicles:**

Market Street – 20<sup>th</sup> January lunch time

Owner of vehicle enters store leaving his engine running and vehicle insecure and unattended, unknown offender approaches vehicle enters and drives off.

### **N1 - Ramsbottom/Tottington/North Manor:**

### **Burglaries:**

Shipperbottom Lane – 16<sup>th</sup> January lunch time

Unknown offenders gain access to property by smashing the rear door panel, an untidy search is conducted and items of jewellery and ipad are stolen.

Walmersley Road – 16<sup>th</sup> January early evening

Unknown offenders approach rear of premises via gated rear yard they use a crow bar to force entry via UPVC door causing damage, once inside an untidy search of the bedroom areas is conducted and items are stolen from within.

### **Burglary Other:**

Pennine Close – 17<sup>th</sup> January early morning

Offender walks down driveway of premises and enters open and unlocked garage door, consumes half a can of lager belonging to the owner and in the process of removing items from the garage he is disturbed and runs off.

Holcombe Brook – 21<sup>st</sup> January early evening

Unknown offenders approach property from an alley at the rear and uses unknown implement in an attempt to force open a door to gain entry, however entry is not gained and no items are stolen.

Holcombe Brook – 21<sup>st</sup> January early evening

Unknown offenders approach premises via back alley and use unknown implement to prise open rear door and gain entry, once inside cash is stolen from a till area.

Railway Street – 20<sup>th</sup> January lunch time

Unknown offender approaches unattended insecure vehicle which is running with the keys inside gains entry and drives away.

Bolton Road West – 22<sup>nd</sup> January early morning  
Unknown offenders approach insecure vehicle and gain entry once inside the keys are located which have been left within and the offender drives off.

### **N1 - Bury West:**

#### **Burglaries:**

Throstle Grove – 17<sup>th</sup> January early evening  
Unknown offenders approach property via rear garden, entry is gained by insecure back door, once inside a tidy search is conducted and items are stolen from within.

#### **Burglary Other:**

Ainsworth Road – 16<sup>th</sup> January early evening  
Unknown offender approaches back yard of premises and climbs over the wall, entry is forced via the back door by an unknown implement, once inside items are stolen from within

#### **Theft from Motor Vehicles:**

Skegness Close – 19<sup>th</sup> January late evening  
Unknown offender approaches parked and secure vehicle and uses unknown implement to open driver's side door, entry is gained and items are stolen from within.

Warwick Close – 20<sup>th</sup> January early morning  
Unknown offenders approach insecure vehicle and gain entry, once inside a search is conducted and items are stolen from the glove box.

#### **Burglaries:**

Mayfair Avenue – 21<sup>st</sup> January early afternoon  
Unknown offenders approach front door of flat and shout out the owners name they carry on calling him names and then kick at the front door causing damage, entry is not gained and nothing is stolen.

### **Theft from Motor Vehicles:**

Church Street – 19<sup>th</sup> January – late evening

Unknown offenders approach parked secure vehicle and use unknown implement to force the top of the front nearside door causing it to bend away from vehicle, entry is gained and various items are stolen from within.

Countess Lane – 21<sup>st</sup> January early morning

Unknown offenders approach secure vehicle and forces lock on front offside driver's door, entry is gained and offender smashes the ignition and part of the steering column then removes centre of the steering wheel and steals this.

### **Theft of Motor Vehicles:**

### **N2 - Whitefield:**

#### **Burglaries:**

Castle Road – 19<sup>th</sup> January early morning

Unknown offenders approach front of property via front gate and use unknown implement to attempt to prise the front wooden door open causing very minor damage, no entry is gained and nothing is stolen.

#### **Burglary Other:**

Ringley Road – 19<sup>th</sup> January early evening

Unknown offenders approach rear of property and climb over the fence and enter insecure premises as trespassers, once inside a search is conducted and items are stolen from within.

### **Theft from Motor Vehicles:**

Ringley Park – 18<sup>th</sup> January early hours of the morning

Unknown offender climbs over the wall and approaches parked secure vehicle and opens the front offside door by unknown means once inside offender steals loose change from within

### N2 - Prestwich:

#### Burglaries:

Butterstile Avenue – 16<sup>th</sup> January late evening

Unknown offenders approach property from the rear and climb over wooden garden fence into the garden, they proceed to the conservatory door which is unlocked and gain entry, once inside a search is conducted and the TV is stolen.

Park Road – 20<sup>th</sup> January late evening

Unknown offender approaches the front of the house and enters into insecure porch then smashes the window of the secure front door reaches in and opens yale lock, once inside offender goes upstairs and speaks to the elderly occupant saying "Don't be frightened I'm only here for money I'm not going to hurt you". The elderly occupant hands over £70 pounds and offender leaves.

#### Burglary Other:

Halliwell Road – 16<sup>th</sup> January early afternoon

Unknown offenders enter rear garden and approach locked and secure wooden shed, by using unknown instrument they force lock and gain entry, once inside they steal a bike frame.

Rectory Avenue – 16<sup>th</sup> January late evening

Offenders unknown gain access to rear of garden by climbing over side fence of adjoining neighbour, offenders then approach detached shed and remove padlock by unknown means, entry is gained and items are stolen from within.

#### Theft from Motor Vehicles:

Bury New Road – 16<sup>th</sup> January early evening

Offender's unknown approach secure and unattended vehicle and smash rear door lock by means unknown, entry is gained and some power tools are stolen.

Windsor Road – 19<sup>th</sup> January early morning

Unknown offenders approach parked and secure vehicle and remove stuck on front and rear number plates.

#### Theft of Motor Vehicles:

Egerton Street – 19<sup>th</sup> January early hours of the morning

Unknown offenders approach parked motor cycle and by unknown means takes and steals the motor cycle.

Highfield Road – 19<sup>th</sup> January early afternoon

Unknown offenders approach parked and secure vehicle and by unknown means takes and steals the vehicle.

### Greater Manchester Police signed up to the Best Use of Stop and Search Scheme.

GMP and Bury Division has set a clear vision for stop and search; to achieve the highest level of trust and confidence in the police's use of stop and search as a means for tackling crime and keeping our streets safe. As a consequence, the use of stop and search in Bury will become significantly more effective and targeted which will lead to better outcomes. It will be conducted with dignity and respect, and be used primarily to protect our communities for violent and key crimes.

Asking individuals to account for their presence or behaviour is an important part of everyday policing. Stop and search is an additional and legitimate power that is used by GMP to protect our communities, tackle crime and keep our streets safe.

In August 2014, the Home Secretary launched the voluntary Best Use of Stop and Search Scheme. GMP has signed up to the scheme and is engaging with partners and communities to implement the scheme.
