St Thomas's Church

The Pimhole area contains several historic buildings. One of the most outstanding is St Thomas's Church.

The church, which stands at the corner of Rochdale Road and Pimhole Road was built in 1866. It is a truly magnificent building with many outstanding features.

The site on which the church is built was a gift from the Earl of Derby and contains over 800 square yards. The church was gifted by Mr Thomas Openshaw, a local benefactor, well known for his many acts of charity.

The church, which is rectangular in form, has a tower and spire 120 feet high, which stand out proudly on the skyline among the many surrounding buildings. The total length of the building internally from west end to east end is 108ft 6in and the total width is 58ft.

Visitors are amazed when they first step inside and see the interior, particularly the beautiful altar window in the chancel, depicting Jesus, Mary, his Mother and all the twelve Disciples gathered round him.

To the right of the main altar stands the calm and peaceful Lady Chapel. This is a beautiful place with many stained glass windows.

Once the building of the church was completed, Sunday and Day Schools were built and the benefactor, Thomas Openshaw taught at the Sunday School and sang in the church choir.

As with many buildings of a similar age and structure, the church suffered very badly from dry rot. The roof is currently being renovated to address this problem.

St Thomas's was consecrated on the 10th December, 1866 and in three years time will celebrate its 150th anniversary.

Pimhole has undergone an amazing transformation over the past few years. The new houses, bringing many families to settle here, has certainly breathed new life into the area. It still remains the fact however, that Pimhole has a proud history and it is fortunate that we are able to appreciate this by the presence of such buildings as St Thomas's Church.
